

Lecture to highlight geologic history

The Historical Society of Frederick County will hold its annual meeting on Tuesday, Nov. 9, beginning at 7:30 p.m. in the commissioners' meeting room in Winchester Hall, 12 E. Church St., Frederick. Historical Society members and the public are encouraged to attend.

Following a brief business meeting, Chris Haugh, manager of Production Services for GS Communications, will lecture on the prehistory of Frederick County.

He recently completed production of his third video on the history of Frederick County. The latest production, entitled "Monocacy: The Pre-history of Frederick County, Maryland," examines the geological and meta-geological events that shaped the region and intro-

duces us to the area's earliest aboriginal populations. Mr. Haugh will share some of what he discovered in creating this video, covering over a billion years of history in one lecture.

Mr. Haugh has been with GS Communications for 10 years, serving for the past eight years as the manager of production services. He is a graduate of the University of Delaware, with a degree in communications. He was the 1989 recipient of the Craven Award from the Delaware Historical Society for excellence in historical research.
